
Fourth Sunday **1**n Advent



God's promise to send a Savior took a very long time, so we first light the Candle of Waiting. As the flame of the candle flickers we remember Jesus' words, "I am the Light of the world" and we light the second candle, the **Candle of Light**. The third candle reminds us of God's great love for us, "For God so loved the world that He gave His only Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have eternal life" and we light the **Candle of Love**.

And now, as our Advent journey draws to a close, we are so very near to Jesus' birth, so very near to the coming of our Savior, our Hope. We light the last candle, the **Candle of Hope,** and we hear these words from John 15:13...

"May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that by the power of the Holy Spirit you may abound in hope.

This will be a sign to you: You will find a baby wrapped in cloths and lying in a manger."

Suddenly a great company of the heavenly host appeared with the angel, praising God and saying,

"Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace to those on whom his favor rests."

When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let's go to Bethlehem and see this thing that has happened, which the Lord has told us about."

So they hurried off and found Mary and Joseph, and the baby, who was lying in the manger. When they had seen him, they spread the word concerning what had been told them about this child, and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds said to them. But Mary treasured up all these things and pondered them in her heart. The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all the things they had heard and seen, which were just as they had been told.

Proposed Amendment to Article B3.03 of the Plc Congregational Bylaws

At the December Ministry Board meeting, the board voted to recommend to the congregation that the Congregational Bylaws be updated. Due to the continued growth of the congregation at Peace Lutheran Church the Ministry Board is recommending the members of the board be increased to seven from the current six. This will allow for better distribution of tasks for committee support. This amendment will be voted on at the annual meeting on Jaunary 27, 2019 and ratified at the January 26, 2020 annual meeting. The proposed ammendment will read as follows:

B3.03 The voting membership of the Ministry Board shall consist of the seven elected members of the Ministry Board.
